Minister's Notes



Best wishes for summer

Last month I began my notes this way: "I would like to share something with interested members of the congregation. It is something that I have been asked to share at different times and in different ways. I would like to share with you, a deeper understanding of what it means to live your life as a Unitarian Universalist and to participate in the shared ministry of our congregation."

I liked that so much I am using it again this month!

What are we to make of the times we are living in? It is certainly a time for change, a time for action, a time for involvement and truth telling.

But we all feel pulled in multiple directions and we all need time to reflect with friends that we can trust. The challenges that we all face to make sense of the world, and to give meaning to our lives need not overwhelm us if we can share and grow in community.

July is my study month. It is my intention to use this time to make more detailed plans for a program that I hope to offer to the members and friends of the congregation beginning in September. That program is intended to delve more deeply into the questions I raised here and in my opening paragraph.

I have already heard from some members and friends who are looking forward to participating in

this program, and I hope you will consider participation as well. I expect to be releasing more details over the summer on uuinfo.

Those participating in the program will be able to meet in person regularly, but online participation will be available to everyone who has internet access.

But July is July in Nova Scotia!

After eight years in Nova Scotia, I have come to realize how glorious and precious the summers are here... and how short. I have learned that it is not wise to plan to accomplish a lot of things during July and August. These months are a gift to us that we should cherish and enjoy and savour.

I am reminded of the story in Jewish midrash of a rabbi who, appearing before G-d after his death, is asked only one question... "Did you enjoy the many gifts that I made available to you in your lifetime?"

The message in the story is that the world is a beautiful place. It would be a terrible waste to turn our backs on this marvelous gift. We are called to appreciate, enjoy, and give thanks for the many blessings in our life... savour them all.

And so, my hope for you, and for me, in the month of July is that we will get to savour the season, enjoying it to the fullest. Let's do what needs to be done but let us not spend any time worrying about schedules and timetables. September will come soon enough!

Board Buzz



The last few months the Board has been using a new method of meeting, with monthly reports being sent in ahead of time so that Board members can read them before the meeting. They are not discussed unless there are questions or issues raised in them. We have then used the extra time for discussion of more strategic matters.

With most church activities closed down for the Coronavirus precautions we have taken the opportunity to have some broad discussions about the role of the Board and the Minister and the future direction of UUCH.

The Board does not plan to meet in the summer, but talks will continue between Rev. Norm, Troy Saulnier the incoming president, and Margaret the outgoing one.

We did also agree to have our Annual General Meeting on Sunday August 30th, to authorize the new Board for 2020-2021. It will probably be a combined online/limited in-person arrangement, but there will be more information coming out closer to the date. Because of the uncertainty of the group gathering guidelines over the next few months we decided not to have a full in-person AGM. We also won't have a congregational retreat this summer.

We discussed options for anti-racism work at UUCH, but it was decided that we would participate in the CUC roundtable call on June 25th before making any decisions. The topic has come up at our Board meetings several times in the past, but with today's demonstrations and public outcry we are considering more specific action for members and friends of the congregation We will send out uuinfo messages with more information shortly.
