It's a pleasure to be writing to the UUCH community for the first time as your Contract Interim Minister! My family and I have been spending some time acquainting ourselves to the remarkable land, sea, and people here in Halifax/Kijuptuk.

I feel a deep sense of appreciation for both the beauty and hospitality here, and I am grateful to be welcomed into this community and country.

I have spent much of the last week in workshops with my fellow interim ministers across the North American Continent. One important takeaway from the workshops for me was the importance of not rushing into my ministry with you. Experiencing and understanding the complexities of a place, of course, takes time to truly understand. I arrive here, knowing something of the history of this place, and I look forward to immersing myself in its present as we imagine and live into our future as well.

My role as your interim minister is to help you discover the path of your future. My hope is that over the course of the fall, we can allow ourselves the time we need to get to know, understand, and appreciate each other. Our task together is to dream, imagine, and become the future of Unitarian Universalism here.

We don't become something from nothing of course, but rather we become using the building blocks of matter and energy that are already present.

So, as we get to know one another, I will be asking you lots of questions. Who are you? What's your essence, your substance? What substrates do we have to work with? What will catalyze your transformation? What kind of energy do we have to put into the equation? What products are we hoping for? What variables can we control? And perhaps most importantly, how much are we willing to experiment and are we willing to have our hypotheses and our assumptions continually troubled and challenged?

These are exciting questions for me, and I hope that you're looking forward to it as much as I am!

I also want to let you know that I am planning on hosting some meet and greet opportunities for you to get to know me and ask questions. Stay tuned for more info about that! In the meantime, feel free to visit my ministry website, revisraelbuffardi.com to learn about me.

I look forward to meeting you as well at our Ingathering Water Ceremony on Sunday, the 11th of September.

It is unclear at the time of writing what the future of the Saturday Brunch is. It is my great hope that we find the volunteers to continue offering this valuable service to our community.

What is very clear is that even though the changing colours, lower temperatures, and shorter days are the harbinger of winter, UUCH is at the cusp of a rebirth.

The club officially suggests a maximum of four guests to be signed in per club member but management does allow generous flexibility on this rule.
