

### From the Reconciliation and Dismantling Racism (RDR) Committee



The annual Africville Reunion will take place on the Africville grounds from July 26th to 28th this year.

Last year, several members of UUCH enjoyed the Sunday Service which is always an important part of the reunion. They were welcomed by the multiple generations attending, original Africville residents and their descendants. Since 2023 was the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Reunion it was a much bigger event than usual, lasting 10 days. This year's smaller event is more typical but the Sunday Service will again play a central role.

We will organize a tour of the Africville Museum, possibly in the fall. # From the Climate Crisis Team Our changing world

Let's talk about climate adaptation. We know our weather is getting more severe with more heat, more dry periods and wetter rainstorms, wilder winds and fiercer wildfires, a warmer ocean and higher storm surges. We are learning to live with these changing circumstances, and one of the most important things we are realizing is that we need to be able to rely on each other. In times of trouble our neighbours and our community can save our lives.

The Mi'kmaq people have long known the advantages of living and working in community, and they are now leading a Truth and Reconciliation initiative in

the North End called *Every One Every Day Kipuktuk/Halifax*. The idea is to bring together the diverse people and cultures of Halifax North to share both learning and teaching activities and fun projects, sharing their skills with each other, while making available the opportunity to learn about the ways of the Indigenous people. Their spring program,



from March until May, emphasized climate action, and how to manage the changing climate, and led up to a celebration of Earth Day on April 22nd. The summer program, July 3rd to 27th has more emphasis on fun projects and group activities, but still with that all-important aspect of getting to know your neighbours.

There is an excellent video showing the origins of the initiative, featuring a well-known figure to UUCH: Debbie Eisan, an Anishnaabe elder who works with the Mi'kmaq Native Friendship Centre in Halifax. Mary-Frances Lynch comes flying through the frame a couple of times too!

And the next time you are near 2169 Gottingen Street check out the action. There could be a program running that you would love to take – or perhaps offer to teach one yourself – and get to be part of the Halifax North community. Be prepared for a changing world.

### And the band played on ...


(after the annual barbecue, June 16th)
